H1N1 SWINE FLU CASES GROW IN WEST VIRGINIA

WHEELING, WV – The number of confirmed cases of H1N1 Swine Flu in West Virginia is currently at 167. Officials at the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources report that 154 of these cases are West Virginia residents and 13 are from out of state, but treated in West Virginia.

H1N1 has been confirmed in the following counties in West Virginia: Berkeley, Boone, Cabell, Greenbrier, Hancock, Jackson, Jefferson, Kanawha, Lincoln, Logan, Marion, Mercer, Mingo, Monongalia, Pendleton, Preston, Putnam, Raleigh Wayne, Wetzel, Wood and Wyoming. Wood County accounts for 69 of the cases in West Virginia and 38 are located in Kanawha County. The Wheeling-Ohio County Health Department is advising individuals:

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after you cough or sneeze. Alcohol based hand cleaners are also effective.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread this way.
- Try to avoid close contact with sick people.
- If you get sick with influenza, CDC recommends that you stay home from work, school and limit contact with others to keep from infecting them.
