Must have ID card issued when enrolled in program

First Time Clients must bring an ID with them when they are enrolling in the program. Once enrolled clients will receive an ID card from the Health Department.

This is a one for one exchange program. Client will receive one syringe for every syringe they turn in up to 20 syringes.

- Alcohol wipes
- Narcan
- Fentanyl Test Strips
- Resource List for Substance Use Disorder
- Information regarding HIV & STD testing
- Information regarding Vaccinations
